SYNOPSIS

The play "JEEP", if set aside by other typical Filipino plays about politics, will give a different dimension with a humorous twist that will surely relate with the viewers. We may think that during the first scenes, the story is predictable. The usual scenarios inside the jeepney that often times we don't mind are usually the ones that affects us the most. Along the ride, there will be different



personalities showing to the audience their perspective and representations in life's big jeepney; the senior citizens, the students, the "Juan Tamad"s, the below-minimum-wage earners, and even the drivers.

The driver itself is one of the main characters in the story because he represented those people with low income, yet passengers kept on complaining about fare price increase and LTO officers made an illegal bargain of license to money. "Puro na lang kayo reklamo! Kung alam niyo lang kung gaano kahirap maging isang drayber. Kung alam niyo lang kung gaano kahirap magsukli ng isang daan, limang daan, o isang libo..."These are some of the few lines in the play that the drivers would've wanted to tell us most of the time as we ride in a jeepney.

During the routine travel of the jeepney, two (2) students rode the jeepney from school, Clara and Dexter. Clara is a thrifty girl who doesn't like to spend things that is expensive and prefers on cheaper materials. She doesn't have any idea on what is recently happening in the society and prefers to be passive rather than being active. On the other hand, Dexter is the opposite of Clara for being actively involve in rallies and currently updated on what is happening in his surroundings.

Despite their individual flaws and differences, they realized that all that is needed to have an interesting jeepney ride is just one single act of kindness; avoiding prejudice and starting conversations. Next time in the jeepney, ask, because when you look to your left or to your right, everyone has a story to tell. After all, DIS IS A PREE KANTRY!

FOR TEACHERS



PLAYWRIGHT'S PROFILE

Christian Tordecillas graduated from the University of the Philippines in the Visayas (UPV), Iloilo City and finished Bachelor of Science in Business Administration Major in Marketing (2004). He was once a Literary Editor of the UPV



publication, "The Accounts" and was a member of Theater Arts Guild of the Philippines. He wrote a lot of literary gems in his lifetime in Filipino and Akeanon (Aklan) languages where most of them were drafts and bits and pieces of ideas for a future play. His first oneact play, entitled "Dyip" made him receive his first Carlos Palanca Memorial Awards for Literature for Dulang May Isang Yugto (2006). DYIP was first staged in Philippine Normal University by Speech and Theater Arts Guild in Education (STAGE) last January 2010, later on staged in many other schools in the country. In June 2011, his play "Ordinary" won the Peace Theater Short Play Writing Competition organized by Dulaang University of the Philippines, Baguio (DUPB). His piece titled "Si Inda, ang Manok, at ang Mga Lamang-Lupa" added a feather in his cap when he received his 2nd Carlos Palanca Memorial Award for Literature under the category: Maikling Kuwentong Pambata (2011).Born in Pasay City and raised in Kalibo Aklan, Tordecillas is a poet, playwright, a story teller and at the same time a collections specialist in a known business process outsourcing in Cubao, Quezon City.
