RATIONALE

"Success without a successor is failure", so the statement goes. This timeless principle underscores the importance of preparing, molding, and nurturing young talent and emerging leaders of today towards positions of leadership and influence for tomorrow. Building a generation of successors implies readiness for the future and readiness for change. It facilitates renewal and survival of groups, and prevents calcification and death of organizations. The flow and infusion of new leadership talent determine the viability and vitality of organizations.

Societies rest on this same readiness for the future. Communities, governments, for-profit corporations and non-profits rely on the qualities, character, and competencies of its leaders and followers. Breeding a generation of young and responsible citizens — who through a process of transformation, develop a deep sense of love of God, love-of-country and understanding of multi-cultural diversity — lays the groundwork for good governance, nation building, and regional development.

A country described by some as a fledgling democracy, the Philippines' potential strength and promising asset lie in the current pool of young people. About thirty per cent of the country's population is below 21 years of age — this represents a fairly young citizenry. Their potentials, however, remain largely undeveloped and untrained owing to several factors — the declining quality of education, foremost.

Many countries in Asia share similar demographics; and where the youth of today will take on the baton of leadership in the years to come.

Developing this pool of fresh human capital towards responsible citizenship (national and global) and accountable leadership requires dedicated and purposeful investment. Investment comes in the form of opportunities for personal, interpersonal and functional growth; and leadership and core (i.e., values and attitudes) development.

The Ramon Aboitiz Foundation Inc. works to elevate lives through a comprehensive approach that champions best practices in community development. In carrying out this brand promise, the foundation recognizes that better lives begin with a community that is ready to effect change. Thus, RAFI gathers future leaders and influencers, particularly the youth, in recognition of their crucial role in nation building.

The Young Minds Academy is one of the many inter-related initiatives and efforts of RAFI through the Eduardo Aboitiz Development Studies Center under its Leadership and Citizenship Focus Area.

PROGRAM OBJECTIVES:

Young Minds Academy is a youth leadership and citizenship development program of the Ramon Aboitiz Foundation Inc. — Eduardo Aboitiz Development Studies Center, aimed at developing young emerging leaders aged 12 – 20 years old:

- to become responsible and pro-active citizens and accountable leaders;
- to become part of a generation of successors ready to serve the public and its interests;
- to become world citizens promoting the virtues of peace, pluralism, respect and multi-cultural understanding.

THE APPROACH:

Young Minds Academy is experiential in approach in a semi-structured learning environment. YMA is a "scholarship" provided by RAFI using experiential education and problem-based learning approaches. The scholars will be exposed to real issues and concerns of our society anchored on the theme for the year. This will enable them to formulate possible solutions through a project model. The scholars will also undergo a series of competence and character development training. These learning sessions form part of the program's curriculum. The program runs for 8 months with modules and sessions conducted and spread out during the summer (April and May), and during weekends and holidays from June onwards.

Each year, the academy will anchor its program and modules to a specific theme. This will serve as the foundation for the annual objectives, criteria and guidelines, module and program design and strategies. The Academy will define and adopt the annual themes.

YMA started in October 2006 with "Environment", "Public Health", "Education", "Governance", and "Poverty and Social Welfare" as themes for the first, second, third, fourth and fifth seasons, respectively. For the sixth to eighth season, the theme is "Urban Development" in support of the Mega Cebu program and framework for long-term and collaborative planning and action towards a more livable, smart, inclusive and sustainable city-region.

PROGRAM MECHANICS:

The program is open for application to all qualified young people ages 12-20, who are interested and committed to be "equipped" and to serve the community in the areas of social development.

The scholarships will be granted on a team basis per category. Interested candidates will undergo the process of application and screening before they will be admitted to the Academy and awarded with the scholarship.

A covenant will be signed between and among RAFI - YMA, the program sponsors, the scholars composing the qualified team and the team accountability partner. The Academy then admits the qualified scholars/ team to the program. RAFI reserves the right to select and accept participating teams as well as to impose sanctions to teams who fail to comply with requirements.

The scholars are categorized based on the following:

- Generation B: 12 16 years old
- Generation A: 17 20 years old

PROGRAM COMPONENTS:

Character and Leadership Building

Through adventure education, scholars are introduced to and apply the concept of responsible citizenship and accountable leadership — initiating them towards practical personal, interpersonal, and leadership skills of: (i) influencing and gaining support (through effective communication, personal impact, and relationship building); and (ii) producing results. This phase of the program also allows participants to discover or re-discover their individual and group success drivers (i.e., values and attitudes crucial in moving individuals and teams toward goal achievement). A major highlight of this component is the introduction of the 9 Pillars of Character and Leadership: (1) Respect; (2) Responsibility; (3) Citizenship; (4) Caring Leadership; (5) Godcenteredness; (6) Trustworthiness; (7) Humility; (8) Fairness; and, (9) Integrity.

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Learning Visits and Youth Exchange:

Exposure to actual situations (problematic or successful) allows participants to have first-hand appreciation and understanding of: (i) dynamics of people-to-people interaction; (ii) problems affecting groups and communities; (iii) solutions offered and adopted by individuals and organizations; (iv) strategies and approaches employed by different groups in addressing their respective challenges; and (v) emerging trends in social, local and international development.

Opportunities for international exchange (for the selected candidates) and people – to – people interaction may form part of this component.

Capability Building

The process equips the scholars with the necessary tools, information, methodologies, techniques and basic knowledge in building concepts and ideas; hence, aiding the scholars from the development to the presentation of the projects through structured learning process. The scholars will be exposed to training and workshops necessary to facilitate understanding and appreciation. The following courses are identified:

- S-Leadership: The Potter's Way (God-centered Leadership)
- ⇒ YMA Adventure Camp (Character and Leadership Building)
- Think Quest (Creative and Critical Thinking)
- Social Discovery Walk (Community Awareness)
- Youth Mapping (Social Development Introduction and Social Research)
- → Thematic Enrichment Session (Theme-based Learning Visits)
- Project Model Development (Immersion, Project Identification, and Proposal Development)
- ⇒ Project Implementation/ Internship (Social Marketing and Dream Block)

Immersion

The process provides the venue for the scholars to gain relevant exposure and to work intensively with people, systems, approaches and practices. The process involves the scholars to be immersed with the locals, areas (problematic or successful), institutions and organizations that will impart knowledge and understanding on the anchored theme for the year.

Project Development

The process of developing critical thinking (analysis and reflection) can be aided by providing the scholars the opportunity to learn by themselves. This 'self-learn' mode will be facilitated through the conduct of research (gathering primary and secondary information through formal and informal, structured and semi-structured processes), analysis and reflection, debate and dialogue.

Once data is obtained and analyzed, participants (through their respective teams) formulate and present recommendations in addressing specific issues, challenges, and concerns. They document this whole process of investigation, analysis, conclusions, and recommendations through a project concept or model.

The projects are developed in partnership with a civil society organization or local government unit, which will serve as field mentor and co-implementing partner of the YMA teams. RAFI internal and external mentors are also provided to the scholars to further enhance their project models. Project models are then presented to RAFI for evaluation, consideration for funding and approval for implementation, if qualified.

YMA teams whose projects did not qualify during the evaluation are asked to do internship at RAFI-EADSC, specifically to support the Mega Cebu program. Apart from their internship deliverables, the teams are also tasked to conduct social marketing to promote and gather supporters for the Mega Cebu program, or to come-up with a 'dream block' exhibit showing how a particular block (portion/stretch) of a community can be improved using smart growth and better block principles.

Conference

Providing the scholars the forum and opportunity to present and advocate their work, a Conference will be organized where these team projects or social marketing initiatives or dream block exhibits will be presented. Forming part of the panel of evaluators will be those representing key organizations that may take interest in the scholars' projects. These representatives will be asked prior to the conference to review and study the project reports and to present their comments during the conference. This event will also serve as the judgment venue of the projects. Enumeration of winners and awarding is done during the Awards and Graduation.

Best of Young Minds Awards and Graduation.

As the annual Academy closes, each member of the team will be given a certificate of participation or recognition depending on the scholar's attendance and compliance with the requirements of the Academy. Special awards will also be given to outstanding teams and individuals, including best projects and presenters. The highest awards to be conferred are the Jon Ramon Aboitiz Medal for Personal Excellence and Roberto E. Aboitiz Medal for Team Excellence.

This is done through experiential tearning sessions, community visits, immersions, and project development anchored on the theme Urban Development.

How to join?

B. Accomplish the following:
