- 1. Per communication from Mrs. Cecilia J. Aquino, SPFL- Japanese Nihongo focal person from Japan Foundation Manila (JFM), this Office announces the Expansion of the Special Program in Foreign Language- Japanese Nihongo and encourages interested teachers to join Batch 4 Summer Training Course dubbed as Course on Japan for High School Classroom Instruction (CJH) to be implemented from April 2016 until March 2019 (3-year course) to start tentatively on April 11- May 13, 2016 at the Applied Nutrition Center (ANC), Banilad, Cebu City.
- 2. The CJH aims to develop the capacity of participants in teaching Japanese language (Nihongo) as well as Japanese culture and society. The participants will gainfully be knowledgeable in Japanese culture and society, and acquire Nihongo proficiency as well as methodology in teaching Nihongo as a foreign language that are essential in the implementation of the DepEd- BSE's SPFL- Japanese. Each year of the 3-year course CJH will include a "Summer Intensive Course" and once a month "Follow- Through" and the 3rd year will include a "10 Day Immersion Program in Japan". (Please see enclosures for more details especially eligibilities for application or qualification requirements for teacher-applicants)
- 3. All interested teachers are advised to send a Letter of Intent noted by the school principal together with an accomplished Application Form (see attached format/template for your reference) and a Letter of Intent from the school principal to manifest her/his intention to offer and support the SPFL-Japanese as part of their school curriculum, to be noted by the Schools Division Superintendent. Letters of Intent must be submitted to the Regional Director thru the CLMD Office (Attention: Dr. Emiliano B. Elnar, CLMD Chief and emailed to Dr. Marcelita S. Dignos, Regional SPFL Coordinator thru email add: marcelitasdignos@yahoo.com) on or before March 11, 2016.

Course on Japan for High School Classroom Instruction (CJH)

Joint Program of DepED/BSE –SPFL and The Japan Foundation, Manila

Batch 4 (NCR and Cebu) S.Y. 2016 – 2019

1. Objective

The "CJH" aims to develop the capacity of participants in teaching Japanese language (Nihongo) as well as Japanese culture and society. The participants will gainfully be knowledgeable in Japanese culture and society, and acquire Nihongo proficiency as well as methodology in teaching Nihongo as a foreign language that are essential in the implementation of the Department of Education / Bureau of Secondary Education's "Special Program in Foreign Language (SPFL): Japanese". The course will be implemented from April 2016 until March 2019 (3-year course). Each year will include a "Summer Intensive Course" and a once a month "Follow-Through" while the 3rd year will also include a "10 Day Immersion Program in Japan". On the final year of the training (S.Y. 2018-2019), the teacher participants are expected to fulfill all requirements for the successful completion of the entire training course that covers 3 years.

2. Duration of Intensive Course in Summer 2016 (Tentative)

April 11, 2016 – May 13, 2016 (Monday to Friday, 9:00 a.m. – 12:00 noon / 1:00 p.m. - 3:30 pm / 24 days)

* Upon completion of the Intensive Summer Course in April to May, the Monthly Follow-through

Training (June 2016 – March 2017) will be conducted

3. Number of available slots

- 20 teachers for NCR; 15 teachers for Cebu (2 teachers from each school)
- The schools that are already implementing "SPFL: Nihongo" but have a shortage
 (schools with only 1 full time/regular Nihongo teacher) of teachers will be given priority.

4. Eligibilities for application

Philippine public high school teachers who meet the following criteria are eligible to apply:

- Priority: Language (English or Filipino) or Social Studies teachers at public high schools in the Philippines;
- teachers who are 40 years of age or younger as of April 1, 2016;
- teachers who have expressed interest and passion in learning the language and culture of countries other than their own, and are firmly determined to acquire and appreciate them;
- teachers who can confirm to complete the entire 3-year training course while applying what

they learned to their students and who will continue teaching Japanese language and culture for a minimum of 2 more years (Contract with DepED/BSE), even after completion of the training course;

- teachers who are in good physical and mental health;

5. Requirements for Completion of the Course

- 80% attendance of the total number of hours per course per year
- Submission of Final Output and other requirements per course per year
 - to avoid discontinuity of the course due to absences in the course when completing requirements for M.A./M.S./Ph.D. and due to other matters, the following requirements will be strictly observed during the 3-year training course (April 2016 until March 2019);
 - **someone who will not be attending Master's Degree / M.A. or M.S./ Ph. D. classes, etc.
 - **someone who could be excused from attending training/meetings related to K to 12 or other seminars and school activities that will be in conflict with the schedule of the CJH courses
 - **someone who could be excused in rendering service during elections (national, local, barangay)
 - **someone who would be able to work on allotment of Local Funds when allowance from DepED Central Office is insufficient.
