RATIONALE AND BACKGROUND

Much have been done for the Philippines to meet the eight Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) set by the United Nations. In Philippine MDGs Progress Report published by NEDA and UNDP, the Philippines was not on track in meeting three of the eight goals—the ones on maternal health, on combating HIV/AIDS, malaria and other diseases and on achieving universal primary education. The other millennium development goals are eradicating extreme poverty and hunger, promoting gender equality and empowering women, reducing child mortality, ensuring environmental sustainability and developing a global partnership for development. The terminal year of MDGs has set a challenge that provides a new benchmark for a rights-based post 2015 development agenda. More recently, the United Nations has release a new set of goals for all member countries through its 2030 Agenda on Sustainable Development Goals.

A. ON - THE SPOT ESSAY WRITING CONTEST

- 1. The essay must be original and must expound on the Sustainable Development Goals Theme: Youth Building Peace
- 2. The Secretariat will provide all materials for the contestants.
- 3. All Essays should be written in English and shall consist of not less than 50 words nor more than 600 words.
- 4. Only the first <u>15 contestants</u>, on a first-come, first-served basis, will be eligible to join the contest.
- 5. All essays will automatically become official property of the SMARTER Philippines.
- 6. No distinguishing mark or name of the contestant shall appear in the entry.

B. EXTEMPORANEOUS SPEECH

Mechanics:

- 1. The topic shall be given on the spot by the judges.
- 2. The contestants shall be 1 minute to prepare and given 3 minutes to deliver.
- 3. Speeches should be delivered in English.
- 4. The style of the delivery shall be conversational, oratorical or a combination of both.
- 5. The contestant should not wear his/her school uniform.
- 6. Use of sound, effects, microphones and props is strictly prohibited.
- 7. Only the first 15 contestants, on a first-come, first-serve basis, will be eligible to join the contest.
- 7. The judges' decision is final and irrevocable.
