#### Sub-Program 1. Sustainable Economic Growth Aimed at Creating Employment Opportunities Component 1-1. Support for Financial Reform, Investment and SME Promotion Policy

#### Direction of Study & Expected Capacity to be Developed

In order to strengthen the industrial competitiveness in order to create employment, the role of private sector investment is important when considering the future mid-to-long-term development of the Philippines. Upon the promotion of private investment, followings are considered necessary:

- (1). Granting investment incentives by specifying fields (electronics industry, business process outsourcing (BPO), tourism, etc.) where the Philippines is comparatively strong
- (2). Promoting new investment in small and medium-sized enterprises for the creation of employment opportunity for those in the middle class or the marginalized to reach 'inclusive growth'
- (3). Relaxing business-related regulations
- (4). Smoothing respective procedures regarding trade and investment
- (5). Setting up the commercial policy

# Sub-Program 1. Sustainable Economic Growth Aimed at Creating Employment Opportunities Component 1-2. Capacity Development of Government Officials, in relation with the focus activities conducted to achieve Sub-Program 1

#### Direction of Study & Expected Capacity to be Developed

Improving administrative abilities and creating systems are closely connected. They are not just vital for tackling the issues that the Philippines is facing, but are also critical for appropriately accepting and implementing assistance from overseas for the urgent and important issues.

This Component 1-2 aims to strengthen administrative function in the prioritized areas in relation to Sub-Program 1 "Sustainable Economic Growth Aimed at Creating Employment Opportunities", by enhancing the basic capacity building of administrative officers in such field as Public Policy, Public Administration, and Transportation Administration and so on.

#### ◆ Accepting University (Number of Fellows) & Features of the Program

#### Meiji University, GS of Governance Studies (3 slots)

The goals of the Graduate School of Governance course are to establish a new realm in the science of public policy, a comprehensive science that integrates the three existing major fields of study (politics and administration, economics and finance, and law), and to develop students into highly specialized educators armed with practical and technical knowledge.

The three programs that form the degree track are both global and local in scope. Their cores consist of, respectively, Public Policy, International Development Policy, and Community Planning and Management. From these standpoints, they take up major topics of immediate relevance to contemporary world issues, including decentralization, "good enough governance," citizen participation, sustainable development, economic development cooperation, regional development, poverty reduction, and crisis management. ## Sub-Program 1. Sustainable Economic Growth Aimed at Creating Employment Opportunities Component 1-3. Enhancement of expertise of government officials in the area of transportation infrastructure

#### ◆ Direction of Study & Expected Capacity to be Developed

Improving administrative abilities and creating systems are closely connected. They are not just vital for tackling the issues that the Philippines is facing, but are also critical for appropriately accepting and implementing assistance from overseas for the urgent and important issues.

This component 1-3 aims at enhancement of expertise of administrative officers who deal with development issues especially in the field of transportation infrastructure development.

#### Accepting University (Number of Fellows) & Features of the Program

### Nagoya University, GS of Environmental Studies, Nagoya University Global Environmental Leaders Program (NUGELP) (3 slots)

NUGELP was established in 2008 to develop environmental leaders who are able to identify and analyze infrastructure and environmental problems from a global and holistic perspective, and propose practical measures to solve the problems, focusing on Asia and Africa. ### Sub-Program 2. Regional Development Administration in Mindanao/ Support for Establishment of Bangsamoro Autonomous Government

Component 2-1. Public Policy

#### Direction of Study & Expected Capacity to be Developed

Mindanao is the least developed region in the Philippines. When Government of Japan provides economic assistance to the Philippines, support for Mindanao is considered to warrant particular focus from the perspective of lifting this area out of poverty. In addition, support for Mindanao is important in the sense of helping to reinforce peace in the region, and by extension, benefiting the stability and development of the Philippines as a whole. Reinforcing our support for the Mindanao peace process is one of Japan's "Four Initiatives" regarding the Philippines. Moreover, building peace and stability in the Mindanao region will also contribute to peace and stability in the Asia-Pacific region, and so is important for Japan in this sense as well.

Based on the 2012 framework agreement on Mindanao peace, and with the formation of the new Autonomous Government of Bangsamoro scheduled for 2016, Government of Japan is moving ahead with support for the new autonomous government in terms of developing systems, strengthening administrative abilities, human resources development, and development planning and policy. Human resource development in the field of public policy who can enhance the future leadership levels and be responsible for system development and public administration in the Autonomous Government of Bangsamoro will be needed in the future.

#### Accepting University (Number of Fellows ) & Features of the Program

### National Graduate Institute for Policy Studies (GRIPS), GS of Policy Studies (3 slots : 2 prioritized slots for Bangsamoro, 1 slot for other organizations)

GRIPS is going to train human resources who are to play central roles in the Bangsamoro Autonomous Government in our new program proposed herein, thereby enabling smooth transition to the autonomous government. Our basic policy for activities and teaching in this program is to develop competencies to establish autonomous government systems and assume public administration roles, cultivate abilities to formulate and implement truly effective socioeconomic policies, and ultimately help Mindanao to emerge from severest situation.

#### One-year Master's Program of Public Policy (MP1)

The MP1 curriculum is made up of core courses, concentration courses, and elective courses. All MP1 students are provided a common interdisciplinary and analytical foundation through the core courses. Students acquire more specialized knowledge by taking courses in one of several concentration areas. Current concentration areas are: Economic Policy, International Development Studies, International Relations, and Public Policy. A wide range of elective courses offers students the opportunity to broaden and/or deepen their knowledge. Practical courses are offered by government officials with extensive experience in actual policy formulation and implementation.

MP1 students produce a policy report in one of the approved concentration areas. The first of two public policy debate seminars, following an introductory course of public policy, develops basic managerial and research skills and helps students select a suitable area of concentration. The second workshop, which is supervised by highly qualified specialists, assists students in choosing a research topic and developing their policy report. In the Summer Program, students work in interdisciplinary teams on important real-world policy issues. This combination of academic and practical knowledge is the hallmark of a GRIPS education.

#### JDS Project in the Philippines (Component 2-2)

#### What is JDS?

The Project for Human Resource Development Scholarship by Japanese Grant Aid (JDS) was established in the Philippines in 2002 founded on the strong and lasting bilateral relations between the Philippines and Japan. ## Sub-Program 2. Regional Development Administration in Mindanao/ Support for Establishment of Bangsamoro Autonomous Government Component 2-2. Infrastructure Development/ Industrial Development

#### ◆ Direction of Study & Expected Capacity to be Developed

Mindanao is the least developed region in the Philippines. When Government of Japan provides economic assistance to the Philippines, support for Mindanao is considered to warrant particular focus from the perspective of lifting this area out of poverty. In addition, support for Mindanao is important in the sense of helping to reinforce peace in the region, and by extension, benefiting the stability and development of the Philippines as a whole. Reinforcing our support for the Mindanao peace process is one of Japan's "Four Initiatives" regarding the Philippines. Moreover, building peace and stability in the Mindanao region will also contribute to peace and stability in the Asia-Pacific region, and so is important for Japan in this sense as well.

Based on the 2012 framework agreement on Mindanao peace, and with the formation of the new Autonomous Government of Bangsamoro scheduled for 2016, Government of Japan is moving ahead with support for the new autonomous government in terms of developing systems, strengthening administrative abilities, human resources development, and development planning and policy. To ensure peace in Mindanao, and to move ahead with the development of its agricultural potential and resources, the development of its infrastructure and the promotion of agricultural and related industries are urgent issues, so human resource development is required in the fields of engineering (especially civil engineering) and agriculture.

#### Accepting University (Number of Fellows) & Features of the Program

### Hiroshima University, GS for International Development and Cooperation (IDEC) (3 slots : 2 prioritized slots for Bangsamoro, 1 slot for others)

Mindanao faces an increasing risk of natural disasters caused by regional climate changes and weak social preparedness and insufficient infrastructure provision. It is urgently needed to design an infrastructure system to realize a resilient and low-carbon society, which includes a) land use and transport network, b) water, energy and resource management systems, and c) disaster management systems. This program aims to foster the training of administration officials in sustainable infrastructure design and environmental management skills. For this purpose, the program provides the following educational program consists of three phases: preliminary education (phase I), practical education and research (phase II), follow-up training (phase III). JDS Fellows will study the Development Technology course, IDEC, and Civil and Environmental Engineering, Graduate School of Engineering.

<u>Development technology course</u> provides the educational program based on engineering and agricultural studies, for designing and realizing a sustainable infrastructure in developing countries from the view point of a) urban and regional planning, b) water and energy resource management, c) agriculture and ecosystem management, d) disaster management.

<u>Department of Civil & Environmental Engineering</u> provides the subjects such as advanced structural engineering, advanced geotechnical engineering, advanced concrete engineering, infrastructure and regional planning, transportation engineering and maintenance of steel structures, which are fundamental to study about the infrastructures for urban development and management. In order to study the disaster prevention, the subjects such as advanced hydraulic engineering, advanced coastal engineering, earthquake geotechnical engineering, environmental disaster prevention and coastal environmental engineering are provided.


